## 2021 Exhibitor Code of Conduct Agreement for Participation in the Outagamie County Fair



All Exhibitors are expected to maintain the following standards:

- Behave in accordance with applicable federal, state, and municipal laws.
- Follow the Rules and Regulations of the Outagamie County Fair.
- Treat all people fairly.
- Respect the property of others.
- Avoid the use of profane, abusive, and sexually explicit language.
- Show kindness to others and give assistance when needed.
- Respect the authority of volunteers and others in leadership roles.
- Be honest and honor commitments.
- Accept responsibility for their personal choices.

The following conduct will not be allowed by any youth participating in the Outagamie County Fair and is subject to disciplinary action, which could include being removed from the fair:

- Possession, use, or distribution of alcohol and other controlled substances, including tobacco products.
- Theft or destruction of public or private property.
- Involvement in sexual misconduct or harassment.
- Unauthorized possession or use of weapons or dangerous materials, including fireworks.
- Fighting or other acts of violence.
- Unauthorized use of vehicles.

### Youth Livestock Exhibitors:

- Follow the IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics.
- Care for my animals in a manner that is responsible and ethical.
- Drenching must be done under the supervision of the Fair's vet with the knowledge of the department superintendent.
- Animals must be fed and watered and pen cleaned by 9 a.m. daily. Exhibitors must continue to maintain the pens/stalls and ensure animal well-being throughout the day.  
(Superintendents have the right to assess a \$50 fee, if needed)
- Show boxes can be checked by department superintendents at any time.

The Outagamie County Fair reserves the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and regulations and arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions, and differences in regard hereto, or otherwise rising out of, connected with or incident to the Fair.

Exhibitors violating any of the above rules will be subject to any or all of the following consequences:

- Notification of emergency personnel if there is reason to believe it is necessary.
- Notification of parents or guardians.
- Individual may be required to appear before the Outagamie County Fair Association Board to explain his/her actions.
- Removal of individual and his/her exhibits from the present year's Junior Fair. Any premiums earned will be revoked.
- Revocation of privilege to enter exhibits in future Outagamie County Fairs.
- Livestock Exhibitors could lose the opportunity to sell at this year's auction and/or next year's auction.

Remember you are representing your family, 4-H club, FFA chapter, or breed organization and the Outagamie County Fair.
